During a time when many organizations are decreasing funding, United Way was proud to announce an increase of almost \$500,000 in *safety net services* programs in addition to the \$2 million invested in *breaking the cycle of poverty*. After hearing the stories of *real* people positively impacted by our work, board chair Curt Culver presented a check to a symbolic group of agency representatives and clients whose lives improved because of United Way.
